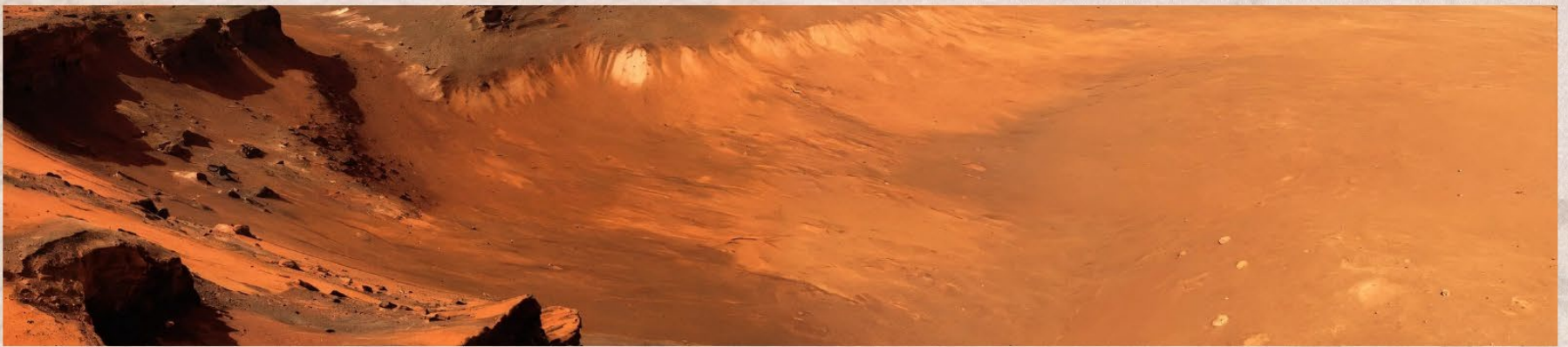


COLONIZING MARS



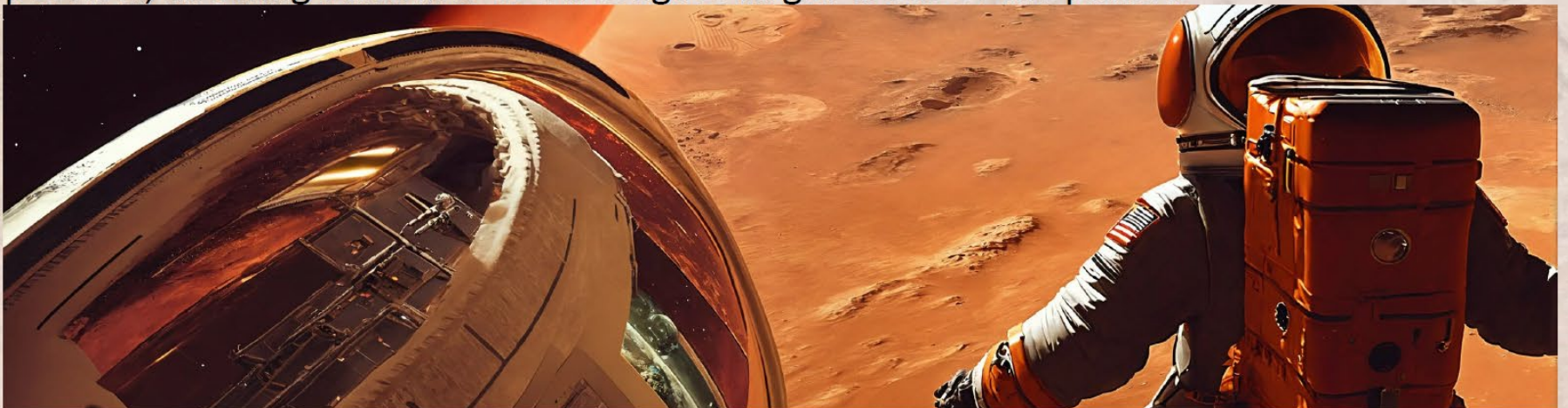
Mars Features

Mars is the fourth planet from the Sun and the seventh brightest in the night sky. It has a thin atmosphere and is considered one of the terrestrial planets, known for its solid, rocky surface. Mars is often called the "Red Planet" because its surface has a reddish color due to its high iron content. Among the planets in our solar system, excluding Earth, Mars is considered the most habitable.



JOURNEY TO MARS

NASA and other space agencies send probes to Mars, which typically take about seven months to reach the planet. Human missions, however, are expected to take much longer—potentially a few years. Many countries, including the United States, the European Space Agency, Russia, India, the United Arab Emirates, and China, have sent spacecraft to Mars. Although many missions have failed, some have succeeded, even if they eventually lost communication with Earth. The limited atmosphere on Mars can make landing and operations challenging. The NASA Curiosity rover and China's Zhurong rover are examples of successful missions. However, the innovative flights of NASA's "Ingenuity" helicopter on Mars have demonstrated that aerial exploration is also possible, allowing scientists to investigate larger areas of the planet.



Colonizing Mars

The idea of colonizing Mars means sending people to live there permanently. This is a big challenge because Mars is very different from Earth. Let's look at some of the things needed to colonize Mars:

To reach Mars, we need powerful rockets and spaceships. SpaceX's Starship is one example. It is designed to take a lot of people and things to Mars. It can be used more than once, which makes it cheaper. NASA's Artemis program is also working on technology for long trips in space, including to Mars.

People need air to breathe, clean water, food, and a way to get rid of waste. Life support systems are what keep people alive in space. These systems have to work well on Mars because it's not like Earth. Some technologies can recycle resources, which helps with sustainability.



People on Mars need safe places to live because Mars has extreme weather, radiation, and dust storms. Habitats (houses) could be made using materials found on Mars, like 3D printing with Martian soil. There also needs to be power sources like solar panels or nuclear energy, and a way to communicate with Earth.

To live on Mars, it's important to use what Mars has to offer. This is called in-situ resource utilization (ISRU). For example, you could get water from the soil or air, and then turn it into oxygen and rocket fuel. This means you don't have to bring everything from Earth.



COLONIZING MARS

If people live on Mars for a long time, they need to be able to support themselves. This includes growing food, using local materials for building, and recycling resources. As more people live on Mars, there will need to be more infrastructure and transportation to explore the planet.

Having people on Mars gives a great chance to study the planet. They can learn about the soil, weather, and if there was ever life on Mars. This research helps us understand more about the universe.

When colonizing Mars, there are ethical questions to consider, like how to protect Mars and avoid contamination. There also need to be rules for how people live together on Mars, including governance and community structure.

In summary, colonizing Mars involves many different challenges, but with the right technology and planning, it could be possible. This would be a big step for human exploration.



Expectations for the Future

NASA has not yet announced a specific date for the first flight of its Mars Weather and Ground Intelligence Explorer. Despite this, the ongoing advancements in extraterrestrial vehicle technology are expected to deepen the search for water and, consequently, signs of life on Mars.

We sing karaoke with beautiful songs in our school. This helps us both have fun and learn at the same time.



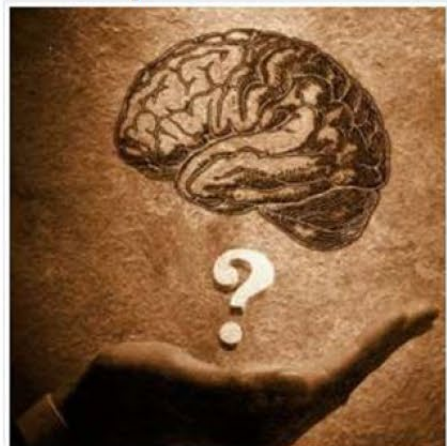

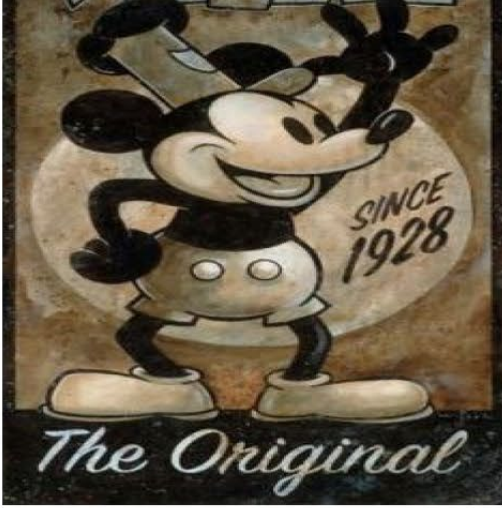

In this event, students give us wonderful moments with various activities. Such as dancing, singing, and reporting on interesting interviews.



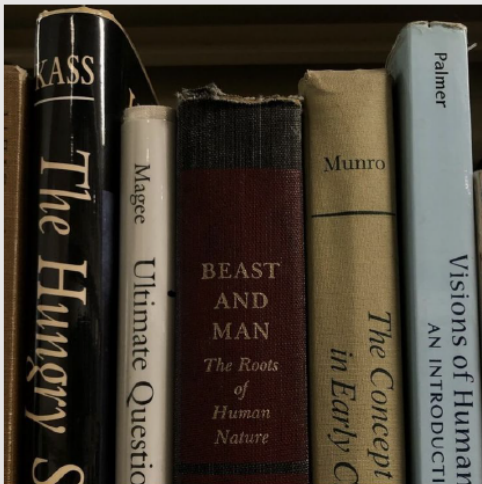

Vincent van Gogh

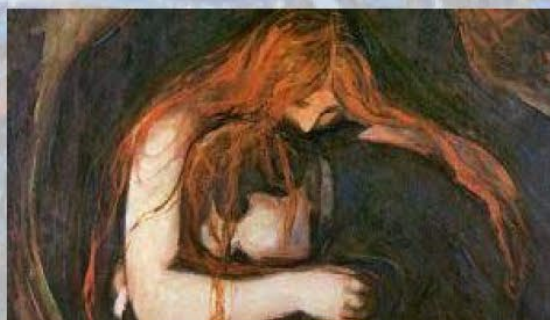
Vincent van Gogh was born on March 30, 1853, in the village of Zundert in Brabant, the Netherlands. Van Gogh is one of the world famous painters.

Salvador Dalí, Catalan surrealist painter. Dali, who became famous for the strange and striking images in his surreal works, completed his most popular work, The Persistence of Memory, in 1931. His most important works are The Melting Clock, The Persistence of Memory, and The Dream Caused by a Bee Flying Around a Pomegranate One Second Before Waking.



Bermuda Triangle

The Bermuda Triangle is an urban legend in the Atlantic Ocean where many planes and ships allegedly disappeared in the past. It is an area that was once thought to be magnetic, but is now thought to host a natural gas source formed by the influence of ocean currents.



"Some, who think that there is a real danger in the Bermuda Triangle, but that this has purely scientific reasons, have tried to explain these mysteries with scientific explanations about methane gas and geomagnetic disturbances. In short, there is neither a situation that requires supernatural explanations nor a situation that requires explaining them with natural reasons

This mysterious event, for which no one could provide a satisfactory explanation for many years, was thought by many people, including scientists, to be "the work of some supernatural forces.

USCG (US Coast Guard) writes about the region on its website:

«The Coast Guard does not recognize the existence of the aforementioned Bermuda Triangle as a geographical area that poses particular dangers to ships and aircraft. In examinations of the many aircraft and ships lost in the region over the years, nothing has been discovered to indicate that the losses were the result of anything other than physical causes. No extraordinary factors have been identified.»



And of course there were accidents in this area. However, some of these coincided with times of severe storms in the region. Researchers examining the accident frequency in the Bermuda Triangle have found that there is no significant difference from the plane and ship accident rates experienced in many parts of the world.

In some cases, there are not even records of ships and planes allegedly lost in this aquatic triangular cemetery; They have never existed outside the imagination of an author. In other cases, ships and planes were real enough, but Berlitz and others neglected to mention that their "mysterious disappearance" occurred during violent storms. In other cases, vehicles sank far outside the Bermuda Triangle.

The sequel was officially announced in November 2019 and animation work began in June 2020, with a different visual style for each of the six universes visited by the characters.

Summary:

KURŞUNLU WATERFALL

Kurşunlu Waterfall is located in the Aksu district of Antalya. It is about 22 kilometers from the center of Antalya. It covers an area of 33 hectares including seven small lakes and waterfalls. KAPUTAJ BEACH

PAMUKKALE TRAVERTINES

Pamukkale travertines are located in Denizli province. There are 17 hot water springs in this region, with temperatures ranging from 100 degrees Celsius to 35 degrees Celsius. I really liked the Pamukkale travertines. There was clay under the water, it was very beautiful, but there was a danger of falling because everything was very slippery. Nowadays, there is a great threat to Pamukkale due to the pollution of nature and its beauties. To prevent this, we must pay attention to cleanliness and not spill factory waste water into the environment.



ERCIYES MOUNTAIN

Mount Erciyes is a mountain located in the Melikgazi district of Kayseri province. Mount Erciyes is a massive stratovolcano and its height is 3,197 meters. MARIANA TRENCH

This trench is one of the secret things in the world. It's very deep and it's huge. You probably have questions about it. What's that trench? Is there anything in this trench? Fish or anything else?

Mariana Trench was formed by the collision of the plaques in the ocean. It's in the Pacific Ocean (under Japan). It's 11 kilometers deep and 69 kilometers wide. Even Mount Everest is shorter than it.

You can't dive into this trench without equipment because the pressure is too much.



Discovery of Mariana

In 1951, a ship named Challenger, discovered the Mariana Trench. Names of the discoverers are Jacques Piccard and Donald Walsh. It was by chance. They dropped a catheter and it fell about 11 kilometers deep.

After the discovery of Mariana, some people dived into the trench. For example, on 26 March 2012, James Cameron (the director of the Avatar and Titanic movies) dived into the trench with a submarine of his own design. He stayed in the deepest point for 3 hours. He didn't see anything, but in the sand examples that he took, there were some undiscovered living things. And people learned that there are living things in the Mariana Trench.

Animals in Mariana

The discoverers of Mariana Trench (Jacques Piccard and Donald Walsh) saw a fish look like plaice. But some scientists said that the fish was a sea cucumber because they didn't think that vertebrates can survive this pressure.




The other fish is *Hirondellea gigas*. It's a type of shrimp. It has to be resistant to the pressure so it uses the aluminum in the sand as armor for its body to protect itself.

The last fish is *snail fish*. It can grow up to 28 centimeters. It was discovered in 2014. It lives between 6 and 6000 meters. It is the largest predator in the Mariana Trench.
